



The monthly Veteran's golf report shows a steady roll-up of players and it is hoped that as the weather warms up, the numbers will increase again.

David Halpin was the stand-out winner today with a massive 40 points! This score included a massive 23 points (3 over par!) on the back nine holes, after he had started his round a little shakily.

Hot on David's heels was Tom Cooke (38 points), who started well and continued to pile on the points in a very consistent display. Tom's 20 points on the back nine wasn't too shabby, either! Close behind, in third place, was Kel Wilton (37 points) who birdied the 10th hole on his way to a fine 21 points on the back nine! Did they play a different back nine to the one my playing group played? We certainly didn't see too many 'easy' shots out there today!

Ball winners were Paul, Ross, Bob, Alex, Don, John and Bruce with Bill Irvine missing out by one shot. The sharpshooter's award for the NTP on the 11th hole was Bob Kearins who caressed his tee shot onto the green and claimed the prize.

The annual **Ladies vs Gentlemen event** saw a field of 6 Ladies and 21 Gentlemen contest a single stableford match with a tight finish guaranteed. After all the scores were added and then divided by the number of players in each "team", the results showed that the "Gentlemen" averaged 29.0 points to edge out the "Ladies" who averaged 27.3 points. Quiet applause greeted the results as they were announced with everyone realising how close the match had been.

The overall results on the day were also very closely fought with **Paul Moore** scoring 35 points to claim the winner's prize on a countback from Stuie Campbell (35 points) and Kel Wilton (34 points) who survived a another countback over Tom Cooke to claim third prize. Ball winners were Tom, Les, Barry, Bill, Ross, Ian, Ken and Jeff. The sharpshooter's award for the NTP on the 11th hole belonged to Kel Wilton who caressed his shot towards the green. The ball sailed unerringly towards the flag and came to ground a mere 50 centimetres short of the hole and bounced tantalisingly close to the hole before coming to rest a mere 51 centimetres behind the hole.

NSW Veterans' Golf Association are getting nearer to some Group boundaries that, if they proceed, will have an effect on us.
